Activities completed in the academic year ASU Webinar – "By Women Urologists"











ASU WEBINAR ON "HEALTHY UROLOGISTS"

Sessions are conducted from 6:30 PM to 7:45 PM, with good attendance and active participant interaction. This course has been well received, with consistent feedback on its practical relevance and clarity. 






ASU Webinar - LUTS & Carcinoma Prostate






OBITUARY:



Dr. George P. Abraham

With deep sorrow and heartfelt condolences, the Association of Southern Urologists (ASU) mourns the sudden and untimely demise of Dr. George P. Abraham on 2nd March 2025. A towering figure in Indian urology, Dr. Abraham was a pioneer in laparoscopic and renal transplant surgery, and a revered teacher, mentor, and academician. Born into a deeply principled household—his father a priest and headmaster—Dr. George P. Abraham was inspired early in life by the discipline and values instilled in him. His natural interest in surgery led him to pursue an MS in General Surgery, followed by a government medical service post. At the insistence of his father, he applied for MCh in Urology and was selected to train at the Government Medical College, Kozhikode, under the mentorship of Prof. Dr. Roy Chally, a legend with over 35 years of experience in the field.

His foundational training in renal transplantation began under Dr. Jayachandran at Guest Hospital, Madras, where he first gained exposure to kidney transplant procedures. A defining moment in his career came at a USICON, where he witnessed Dr. Mohan Rao, formerly from Vellore and then working in Adelaide, present his experience with laparoscopic donor nephrectomy. Deeply inspired, Dr. Abraham traveled to Adelaide for specialized training in the procedure and became one of the earliest urologists in India to adopt and introduce laparoscopic donor nephrectomy in Kerala. Dr. George P. Abraham's contribution didn't stop with clinical excellence—he was a committed educator. He trained many urologists through a structured transplant fellowship program, laying the foundation for a robust kidney transplant ecosystem in Kerala and across India.



He was a sought-after surgeon for live operative workshops and demonstrated complex laparoscopic and transplant procedures not only in Kerala but at numerous national conferences across India, inspiring a generation of urologists.

Based in Kochi, Kerala, he served as the Head of Department and Senior Consultant in Urology and Renal Transplantation at VPS Lakeshore Hospital, where he remained actively engaged in patient care, surgical innovation, and academic leadership until his final days. Just a week before his passing, Dr. Abraham delivered a memorable lecture on Laparoscopic Donor Nephrectomy at the ASU Conference held in Hyderabad. His talk was marked by humility, clarity, and profound wisdom—leaving an indelible mark on all who attended. That presentation now stands as a fitting tribute to his lifelong service to urology.

Dr. Abraham held an exceptional academic profile: BSc, MBBS, MS, MCh (Urology), and was a Fellow of the International College of Surgeons (FICS) and Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons (Glasg). Among his groundbreaking achievements were Kerala's first cadaver kidney transplant, first PCNL in Kerala, India's first 3D laparoscopic donor nephrectomy, and the training of dozens of urologists through fellowship programs. His surgical legacy includes over 3,300 renal transplants, over 8,500 PCNLs, over 12,000 URSs, over 12,000 TURPs, and over 9,000 laparoscopic procedures. He also conceptualized and led India's first 3D laparoscopic urology workshop (Lapendofusion), and was widely respected for his live operative demonstrations across both regional and national platforms.

In recognition of his unparalleled service to Indian urology, he was honored with the Bharat Chikitsak Ratan Award, Bharat Vikas Ratna Award, and Lifetime Health Achievement Award. As a National Board-accredited postgraduate teacher, he mentored generations of budding urologists, shaping the future of Indian urology with wisdom, compassion, and excellence. On behalf of the ASU Council and all its members, we extend our deepest condolences to his bereaved wife, his son Dr. Datson George—an accomplished urologist himself—and the entire family. We share your grief and pray that you find strength and peace during this difficult time. Dr. George P. Abraham's legacy will remain a beacon of inspiration for the Indian urological fraternity. His unwavering commitment to clinical excellence, innovation, and education will continue to influence and uplift generations to come. May the noble soul of Dr. George P. Abraham rest in eternal peace.
